OUR CHURCH

Heritage Presbyterian Church (est. 1986) in Warrenton, VA, is a **growing and revitalized church** with 200 members (+60 members over the past three years). The atmosphere of our congregation is comfortable and welcoming, and we enjoy being with one another. We gather for worship Sunday mornings, followed by Sunday School for ages pre-school to adult (spring/fall). Our liturgy is relatively traditional Presbyterian/Reformed, and various portions of the service are led in French, Spanish, and English, the three languages represented in our congregation. A weekly "children's sermon" precedes the morning sermon and families worship together (nursery is provided from birth to age three). Music consists of a variety of hymns and contemporary songs, and we observe Communion weekly.




Sunday School is well attended, with a large wave of children coming through the elementary school ages. Our growing Youth Group (Grades 6-12) is currently led by a ruling elder and volunteer team, with an expected 30 youth in attendance this fall. We are engaged in the community and with one another through community groups, men's and women's bible studies, a monthly dinner at a local family shelter, bi-weekly Kids Club, a monthly fellowship luncheon, summer ultimate frisbee in the park, our yearly "Men's Pig Roast," and spontaneous meetups.



The Session consists of Lead Pastor Dan Warne and seven ruling elders. There are four men in the Diaconate and four in training. Financially, the church owns its facility outright and carries no long-term debt. Congregational giving consistently meets budgeted needs. This has enabled substantial, sustained investment in missionary support, which is an enduring passion of the congregation. Heritage is generous with and supportive of its pastors. We are committed to providing a call package that will allow our Associate Pastor to labor faithfully and fruitfully at Heritage during his tenure.

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OUR TOWN



In Warrenton proper, the walkability, quaint shops, Warrenton Farmers Market, and historic charm draw people to gathering in Historic Downtown. Numerous wineries and breweries are found along scenic drives. Warrenton restaurants open up onto Main Street in the summer, creating a place for the community to come together. Most day-to-day needs can be met at one of the five grocery stores in town. A 15-20 minute drive to Haymarket and Gaines-ville opens up more options.

Fauquier County, at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, is known for rural preservation and equestrian sports. The Appalachian Trail clips the northwest corner of the county. Most of us work in Northern Virginia, about 25 miles from Warrenton. Fauquier County has become a sought-after location with a rich quality of life compared to the high population areas of Northern Virginia.

WORSHIP (CELEBRATING GRACE)

When we meet to worship God, because of Christ, in and through the Holy Spirit, we believe that God's people receive his grace through the gracious means he has appointed. These ordinary means of grace are the reading and preaching of the Word, the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and prayer. God is glorified when we come to worship acknowledging our need for God's grace, and respond together to the grace God gives with grateful praise.

In addition to general pastoral duties, the Associate Pastor will be given ownership of one or more areas of ministry focus. We list some of our current areas of need and opportunity below. However, opportunities are not limited to these areas. Assigned areas of ministry focus will take into account the incoming Associate Pastor's gifts and experience.

YOUTH AND FAMILY

There are ample opportunities for a man with a heart to walk with and encourage our growing number youth and young families as they learn to live deeply rooted in Jesus!


MUSIC LEADERSHIP

ASSOCIATE PASTOR JOB DESCRIPTION HERITAGE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Position Title: Associate Pastor

Reports To: Lead Pastor FLSA Status: Exempt

Salary: 125k+ (total package), commensurate with experience and cost of living

OVERVIEW

The Associate Pastor is a full-time pastoral position at Heritage Presbyterian Church. The Associate Pastor, under the oversight of the Lead Pastor, is meant to be a "pastoral generalist." That is, he is intended to be a full participant in all aspects of pastoral ministry in the church.

As a minister of Word and Sacrament, the Associate Pastor will be engaged weekly in leading Lord's Day worship. The Associate Pastor will also assist in support of the Diaconate, Staff, Ministry Coordinators, and Committees. In addition to the general pastoral duties of a pastor called by the congregation, the Associate Pastor will take oversight of ministry focus areas. **These focus areas will be assigned according to the gifts and experiences of the Associate Pastor and the current needs of the church.**

Mentorship and growth opportunities beyond engagement with the Lead Pastor and Session will be provided. The Associate Pastor is expected to be engaged as a churchman in Potomac Presbytery and at General Assembly.

REPORTING

The Associate Pastor reports directly to the Lead Pastor, who will supervise and provide guidance in day-to-day responsibilities. The Associate Pastor is a member of the Session and is expected to attend and participate in all Session meetings.

GENERAL PASTORAL DUTIES

Worship (Celebrating Grace)

- Assist in preparing the weekly liturgy.
- Lead Prayer of Adoration, Confession of Sin, and Assurance of Pardon upon request.
- Preach, on average, every 6-8 weeks and as requested (Goal: 12 sermons per year).
- · Participate in administering the sacraments.

Community (Nurturing Growth)

- Pray for the congregation and assist with pastoral visitation and shepherding.
- Practice hospitality and build relationships with HPC members and visitors.
- Develop HPC Discipleship Program with the Lead Pastor and Session.
- Teach in a variety of Christian education and discipleship contexts.

Mercy (Loving Neighbors)

- Pray for HPC efforts to love our neighbors as ourselves in Warrenton and Fauquier County.
- Build relationships within the community that open avenues for the gospel.
- Support and suggest local mercy ministries that further HPC mission and vision.
- Assist Lead Pastor in providing feedback and support to the Diaconate.

Mission (Praying, Sending, Going)

- Pray for and support members sharing the gospel in various callings and contexts.
- Cultivate a heart for local and global missions within our congregation.
- Participate as requested in Missions Trips and efforts of the Missions Committee.
- Show hospitality and encouragement to visiting HPC supported missionaries.

ADDITIONAL EXPECTATIONS

Denominational Involvement

- Pray for and pursue the peace and purity of the PCA.
- Attend all meetings of Potomac Presbytery and General Assembly.
- Serve, as able, on committees of Presbytery and General Assembly.
- Maintain awareness of the major issues facing the PCA.

Pastoral Sustainability

- Meet weekly with the Lead Pastor for prayer, fellowship, and ministry collaboration.
- Give ongoing attention to family life and physical health. Any financial need for personal or family counseling will be offset by HPC.
- Receive mentoring and ministry counsel beyond the Lead Pastor and Session:
 - The Session will engage a CMM "Gospel Coach" for all pastoral staff.
 - The Associate Pastor is encouraged to participate in a formal pastoral peers group for support and encouragement (the Session is open to offsetting the costs of such involvement).
 - Attend Twin Lakes Fellowship pastoral retreat as able yearly with the Lead Pastor (cost covered by HPC).
 - Engage in regular study—formal or informal—outside of ministry responsibilities. Heritage will provide the Associate Pastor with one week of study leave (in addition to 4 weeks vacation) and is open to offsetting costs of formal education programs.

And any other duties needed to support the congregation and ministries of HPC.









SEARCH PROCESS

Our search process is focused on building relationships with candidates. We are not looking for the most impressive, experienced, or gifted candidate; rather, we are looking for the candidate with whom we connect most deeply and whom we believe will connect most readily with the congregation.

An ideal candidate will have two or more years of ordained or relevant experience, and desire to serve in a relational and collaborative pastoral team model, where mutual fellowship and accountability characterizes relationships among the pastors and elders.
